Foxfire

Foxfire series edited by Eliot Wigginton

Foxfire books were part of a class project of teachers and students of Rabun Gap-Nacoochee School, Rabun County, Georgia, located in the Appalachian Mountains of northeast Georgia. Students interviewed local residents concerning everyday life, crafts and traditions in Appalachia. There are 14 books in this series.

1. *The Foxfire Book*, edited by Wigginton and his students, 1972, topics: hog dressing, log cabin building, mountain crafts and foods, planting by the signs, snake lore, hunting tales, faith healing, moonshining.
2. *Foxfire #2*, edited by Wigginton and his students, 1973, topics: ghost stories, spring wild plant foods, spinning and weaving, midwifing, burial customs, corn shuckin's, wagon making.
3. *Foxfire #3*, edited by Wigginton and his students, 1975, topics: animal care, banjos and dulcimers, hide tanning, summer and fall wild plant foods, butter churns, ginseng.
4. *Foxfire #4*, edited by Wigginton and his students, 1977, topics: fiddle making, springhouses, horse trading, sassafras tea, berry buckets, gardening.
5. *Foxfire #5*, edited by Wigginton and his students, 1979, topics: ironmaking, blacksmithing, flintlock rifles, bear hunting.
6. *Foxfire #6*, edited by Wigginton and his students, 1980, topics: shoemaking, 100 toys and games, gourd banjos and song bows, wooden locks, a water-powered sawmill.
7. *Foxfire #7*, edited by Gillespie and his students, 1980, topics: ministers and church members, revivals and baptisms, shaped-note and gospel singing, faith healing and camp meetings, foot washing, snake handling.
8. *Foxfire #8*, edited by Wigginton, Bennett and their students and his students, 1984, topics: southern folk pottery from pug mills, ash glazes, groundhog kilns to face jugs, churns, roosters, mule swapping and chicken fighting.
